Getting vaccinated against Covid-19 for those born in 1941 or before

Your Covid-19 vaccination will be given at your health centre, and you need to register if you want to be vaccinated. You can do this by calling your <u>health centre</u> and following the instructions. Your health centre will then call you when it is your turn to be vaccinated. Please note that this may take a few weeks.

The date of your appointment will depend on access to the vaccine and your age. We are following the Public Health Agency of Sweden's order of priority and vaccinating Kronoberg's oldest residents first. Everyone who registers to be vaccinated will be contacted by their health centre and will have the opportunity to be vaccinated. If your health centre cannot contact you by telephone, an invitation will be sent to you. Please bear in mind that it may take a while before you are contacted. Thank you for your patience.

Be alert to possible fraud

Region Kronoberg will never ask you for your log-in information or bank details. If someone calls you and asks for these details, hang up and contact the police.

Preventing infection when travelling for your vaccination

If you use mobility services or are aged 85 or older and cannot arrange your own transport, you can book free transport through Region Kronoberg.

- Book your vaccination appointment first.
- Then book your transportation by calling 0470-58 85 60 on weekdays between 07:00 and 19:00.
- Transportation can be booked no sooner than 14 days before your vaccination day and no later than 12:00 on the day before your vaccination.

Important information before receiving your Covid-19 vaccination

- Two doses of the vaccine will be given per person. The second dose will be booked when you are given your first dose.
- If you cannot come at your booked time you will need to cancel or re-book your appointment, otherwise you will be charged a fee for a missed visit.
- If you have symptoms of a cold even mild symptoms you will need to re-book your vaccination appointment.
- Arrive shortly before your appointment to avoid having to wait for a long time with other people, and keep your distance from others during your visit.
- Please wear clothing that makes it easy for the person giving the vaccine to get to your upper arm.
- Have your ID documentation readily available.
- Depending on the type of vaccine, you may need to stay at the health centre for monitoring for 15 minutes after your vaccination.
