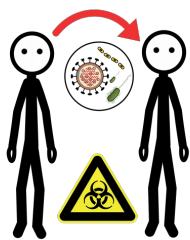
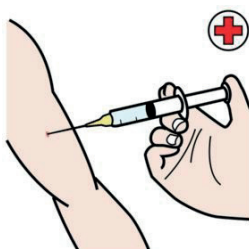


# About the COVID-19 vaccine



The coronavirus can make us ill.

Most people are not very ill but some people are very ill.



You can be vaccinated against the virus so you don't get ill.

The vaccine makes your body stronger against the virus.

If lots of people have the vaccine, the virus may stop spreading.



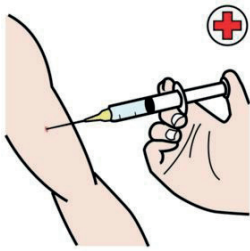
The vaccine has been tested on lots of different people.

This means we know it is safe and that being vaccinated is not dangerous.



Almost all adults can have the vaccine.

People who are most at risk of being seriously ill will be vaccinated first.



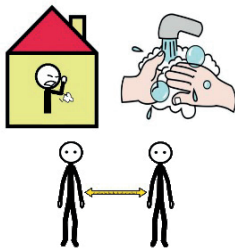
If you want to have the vaccine, a nurse will give you an injection.

The vaccine will be injected in your arm.

You may need to have more than one injection but not at the same time.



The vaccine is free. You do not have to pay for it.



After you have been vaccinated, you must continue to:

- Wash your hands
- Keep a distance from other people
- Stay at home if you are ill so you don't infect other people



You decide if you want to be vaccinated.
